# Olga Arjibay Wood

**O**lga Arjibay Wood, of Grand Island, Florida, passed away after a long illness on Monday, November 16, 2020. She was 78. Olga is survived by her son Carl and daughter-in-law Pamela of Norman, Oklahoma; her sister Tayra of Longmont, Colorado; her nephews Albert, Tony, and Turin of Lake County; nieces Mariane of Lake County and Tanya of Anderson, South Carolina; sister-in-law Pauline of Lake County; grand nieces Angela and Samantha of Lake County, Kasey of Anderson, South Carolina, and BoAnn of Volusia County; and several cousins. Olga was preceded in death by her father Antonio, mother Olga, brothers Antonio and Arturo, sister-in-law Raquel, nephew Arthur, and grand niece Amanda.

Olga was born on May 7, 1942 in Cuba. Her family moved to Georgia in 1951 and eventually to Florida later that decade. 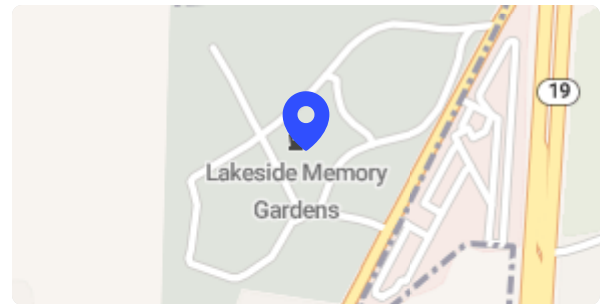
