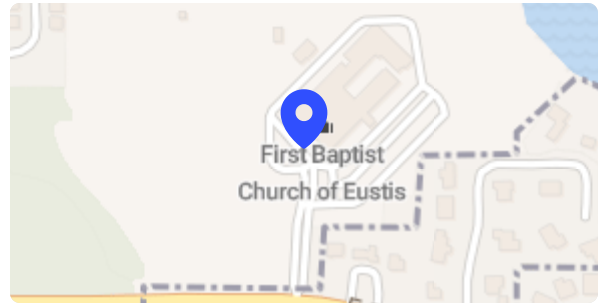

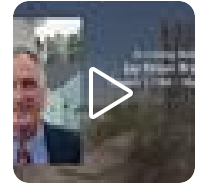

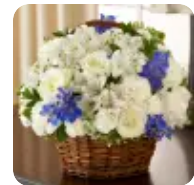

That night could've been a disappointment, but because of Jay and a group of our friends, it became something sweet and fun. I keep thinking I need to find that prom photo—it captures just a sliver of the kindness and light he carried. After high school, when life took us to different places, Jay stayed close for a while. While he was away at college, we wrote letters—always in code, full of acronyms we had to decipher. I don't remember how it started, but it was so Jay—a little silly, a little smart, always fun. Several years ago, I had the unexpected joy of running into him for the first time in a few decades at a First Friday event in Eustis and meeting his beautiful family. That night was a gift I didn't know I'd treasure so deeply. Losing Jay feels like losing a piece of those golden teenage years. 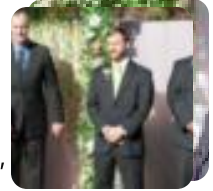

I met Jay in 2010, during my final year of college. I was 22 and living in Jacksonville Beach with my roommate Kevin. One fall evening, Kevin and I were relaxing in the front yard, enjoying a beer by his chiminea, when we spotted Jay and his future wife, Michelle, across the street. We invited them over for a drink. Little did we know, that simple gesture would mark the beginning of one of the most meaningful friendships of my life. Jay was 20 years older than us, and to us, he was the coolest guy we'd ever met. We were two broke kids living in a rundown 1950s shack, and he had it all—a great house, a cool truck, a thriving career, and a wonderful girlfriend. But what stood out the most was that he genuinely wanted to be our friend. Every Saturday, we'd gather to watch college football, share a few beers, and enjoy Jay's cooking. Those weekends became some of the best memories of my early adulthood. A few years later, Jay and Michelle were expecting their daughter, Victoria, and decided to move into a larger home. I was bummed when he told us they were moving, but then Jay surprised us: he offered Kevin and me the chance to rent his house—far nicer than ours—for just \$100 more a month. To us, it was an unbelievable gesture. Jay was a king in our eyes, and we couldn't sign the paperwork fast enough. Even after he moved, Jay stayed close. Though his family became his priority, he never drifted far. He helped me with my first girlfriend and when I was preparing to get married, there was no question in my mind that I wanted Jay to officiate our wedding. I knew he'd bring the perfect mix of heart and humor—and he didn't disappoint. As the years passed, life got busier. Even though we didn't see each other often, Jay was always there—offering advice, sharing laughs, and lending a hand when I needed it most. I especially loved watching our children play together. Those moments reminded me of how our lives had grown and stayed intertwined. I've had many friends, but none like Jay. He was more than a friend—he was a mentor, a neighbor, a big brother, a legal advisor, and an all around outstanding human being. My heart goes out to his family and to everyone lucky enough to have known him.

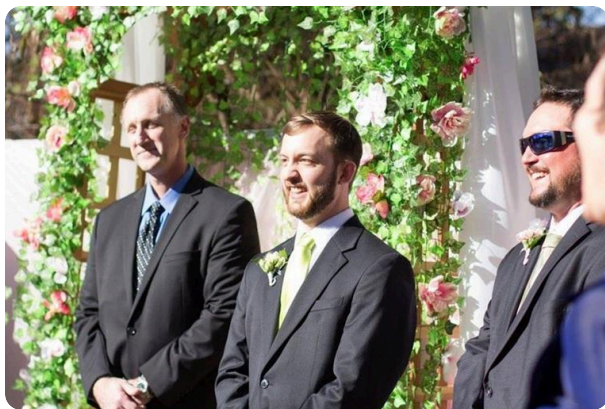
